Characteristics of Good Learning Outcome Statements					Suggestions for Improvement
1. Action	1	2	3	4	
All of the statements are written in active voice and the action words have been carefully chosen to describe the intention.

All of the statements describe what you envision learners doing “after” and “outside” this experience – because of this learning experience.					
3. Scope	1	2	3	4	
Given the time and resources available, the outcome statements represent reasonable expectations for learners.					
4. Complexity	1	2	3	4	
The statements, as a whole, have sufficient substance to drive decisions about what the learners need to learn in this experience.					
5. Brevity and Clarity	1	2	3	4	
The language is concise and clear, easily understood by learners and other stakeholders.					



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
